Amistad Captives. Gravestone honoring the six men of the Amistad buried in the Grove Street Cemetery who died in New Haven, September 3–December 31, 1839: Fa, September 3; Tua, September 11; We-lu-wa, September 14; Ka-pe-li, October 30; Yam-mo-ni, November 4; and Ka-ba, December 31.

1 LOCATION: B MAGNOLIA

Leonard Bacon, 1802–1881. Prominent anti-slavery leader, minister of Center Church, and advocate of the Amistad Captives.

2 LOCATION: 52 CEDAR

Roger Sherman Baldwin, 1793–1863. Defense attorney for the Amistad Captives; later Governor of Connecticut and U.S. Senator.

John Warner Barber, 1798–1885. Artist, engraver, and publisher. Author of *A History of the Amistad Captives*, 1840. (Stone in poor condition.)

4 LOCATION: 28 CEDAR

George E. Day, 1814–1905. Yale Divinity Professor who supervised the instruction of the Amistad Captives by Yale Divinity School students.

5 LOCATION: 4 MAGNOLIA

Josiah Willard Gibbs, Sr. 1790–1861.

Yale Professor of Sacred Literature and linguist who found the interpreters for the Amistad Captives.

6 LOCATION: 51 LOCUST

Nathaniel Jocelyn, 1796–1881. Artist who painted the portrait of Cinque in the New Haven Museum.

7 LOCATION: 5 CENTRAL

Colonel Stanton Pendleton, 1798-1858.

New Haven jailer and caretaker of the captives in Westville.

8 LOCATION: 34 LINDEN

Arthur Tappan, 1786–1865. Abolitionist and Founder of American Anti-Slavery society with William Lloyd Garrison. Brother of Lewis Tappan, Amistad Committee member. (Stone in poor condition.)
